Children falling in Moat	1	3	3	Rails between boardwalk and moat prevent access to edge of moat Warn and watch children Each pond dipping group/location to be supervised Cover any broken skin with waterproof plaster / wear waterproof gloves. If flu like symptoms develop in the next few weeks tell doctor you have been pond dipping. Reassure; clean with sterile water if needed. Reassure and remove sting, treat with sterile water. (be aware of possible allergic reaction / anaphylactic shock – get medical help immediately) Warn children Only likely in summer. Children likely to suffer should already be known to staff. Try to stop sufferers rubbing eyes Children should come prepared – wear sun hats. Warn and keep away from pond edges (unless pond dipping) Warn – clean hands with wash gel warn and watch

P = probability of accident or injury S = severity of injury each assessed on a scale of 1 – 5. Multiplied together they give an overall assessment of the risk of accident or injury. The higher the score the higher the risk. Anything over 10 should make one reconsider.
